## **Chamber Announces Business Leader of 2018**

Dale Wentworth settled in Kelowna in 1966. Shortly thereafter, he teamed up with his parents, Walt and Vera, and opened a small music store, Wentworth Music, in the Capri Shopping Centre. The new company's mission was providing music lessons; and sales, rentals and repairs of a broad range of musical instruments, chief among them, guitars. Three years later, Hedy Wentworth, Dale's wife for 48 years, joined the family business as a music teacher.

"Not much has changed with our core values over the last 52 years," says Dale Wentworth. "I assumed the dual roles of CEO and President of Wentworth Music in 2003. We are bigger now, with four store locations in the Okanagan and an internationally recognized Music Education Centre. Still, we are a business that focuses on community values. We moved into our third generation of family ownership when our sons took over major corporate roles. Noel is Vice-president of Education and Media; Neil is Vice-president of Finance; and Nori is Vice-president of Sales. Hedy, along with Noel's wife, Lora, and Neil's wife, Joanna, round out the family work team. Our company currently employs a fun-loving staff of 65."

The name 'Wentworth' has been synonymous with music from the beginning of the company's operations. Wentworth was involved with the Kelowna Regatta for many years, providing live music and producing venue pre-shows. He became a respected music examiner and adjudicator throughout western Canada. He was a founding member and first President of the Kelowna Registered Music Teachers' Association and was a member of its Kelowna contingent to EXPO 74 in Spokane. Wentworth Music has been a proud ambassador of Kelowna and the Okanagan and was recently honoured when selected as one of the Top 100 Music Businesses in the World by NAMM – the 10,000 member National Association of Music Merchants.

A strong commitment to community has always been at the core of the Wentworth family business. Dale Wentworth and his team have proudly supported numerous not-for-profit organizations over the years. Today, Wentworth Music is probably best known for its student-based rock 'n' roll productions at the Kelowna Community Theatre. With local partners Interior Savings Credit Union and K96.3 Radio, these semi-annual shows have raised almost a quarter million dollars in support of children's wards in local hospitals including the JoeAnna's House project.
